Got a few peeks in the sucker holes. **During totality the cloudy sky grew so dark you'd swear a storm was about release a deluge of rain or snow**. Went down the Burin Hwy a little ways didn't like what I saw and doubled back to Goobies. Meet one current member and one past observing director.



My choice of location was finalized on the morning of the eclipse. (Thanks to Nikolay's final report) I had this area in mind for quite a while but made it the final choice that morning. I brought my good friend Terrance Hounsell with me on the trip. He was also able to image the eclipse. I drove west on hwy 210 which branched to hwy 211 and then to Branch road. This location is **just north west of the Burin Peninsula**. I found a parking lot that had at least 20 people residing when I arrived. (Mostly locals)

I had arrived early to the town of Swift Current and originally had planned to stay there but my friend Terrance convinced me to take a sight seeing tour to Terrenceville which is on the north west side of the Burin peninsula. On that trip I discovered a major clearing in the western sky. It was sunny when I got there. I changed the plan and located the parking lot on Branch Rd. My brother had found that road and showed it to me on the morning of the eclipse. I had thought that it was a gravel road at first but it turned out to be a good paved road.

The sky was almost completely clear when I arrived. There were some low clouds passing by during the eclipse. Also high winds that I assume were caused by the high pressure to the west.

I used a Nikon P 900 zoom camera and the filter that Randy gave me for the eclipse. (Thanks Randy) It worked very well. I removed it for the total eclipse. Most images are snap shots from a 1080 p video.


























2024 Solar Eclipse Recap Piper's Hole River, Burin – Tim Caruk, Sue Hart
